Compagnia Toscana Sigari (CTS) was born from the passion for the world of slow-smoking of the founder and his collaborators, who live in an area that gave birth to the culture of Italian tobacco. Thanks to their motivation to enrich the current world of Italian cigars, they decided to bring to the public the Mastro Tornabuoni, a new and innovative product, which dwells its roots in a much deeper history than any other Italian cigar. The area where the manufacture is present nowadays, Sansepolcro, was in fact the main scene for the birth of Italian tobacco in the second half of the sixteenth century. During the reign of Pope Gregory XIII, Cardinal Nicolò Tornabuoni, apostolic nuncio in France, sent some new seeds to his uncle, the Bishop of Sansepolcro. The seeds sent were just described and characterized by Jean Nicot in France, and were then called and identified as *Nicotiana tabacum*. Thanks to the flourishing culture and market of tobacco caused by the spread of these new plants from the Tiber Valley, a successful market was established in the adjacent Republic of Cospaia, a tiny independent state (less than 400 hectares in all), born to a topographical error and situated between the Papal State and the Republic of Florence, later becoming the Grand Duchy of Tuscany.

Realized exclusively with indigenous Italian kentucky, fire-cured with oak wood. Ideal to be smoked pure or blended with other tobaccos. If added within a mixture it intensifies the mix, adding evolution and the typical aromas of our Kentucky: soil scents, leather, pepper and smoked wood, creating a rustic and dense smoke.

STORTIGNACCOLO

This cigar is produced with the uttermost care with the help of historical machinery, perfectly restored and still 100% original in their form and work. The choice of using machines used decades ago is a real tribute to the days gone by. As with all of our cigars, all the tobacco leaves used are not pre-frozen or collected mechanically, but they are processed and worked strictly by hand in our Manufacture. The machine functioning and cigar construction is put forth and regulated by one of our Sigaiaie (Italian term for torceador, cigar girl/woman) always present by the machine. The Stortignaccolo cigars will be medium-filler cigars, with a finely selected and special blend; All the details will be released at the time of submission, but we anticipate that it will be composed of fine tobaccos, all of Italian origin.
